Trail Descriptions:

Alta Vista – is known for its beautiful tree lined streets, sidewalks, and great location close to downtown Greenville, South Carolina.
Also located along the historic corridor of Augusta Road and Augusta Street.

Country Club - established in 1923 and has stood as one of Greenville’s truly historic membership organizations and continues to be one of the finest in South Carolina.

Lake Conestee Nature Park – a 400-acre park along three miles of the Reedy River in Conestee, SC, with 12 miles of trails, more than 6 miles of them paved and 1 mile of boardwalk. The park contains both hardwood and evergreen forest, extensive wetlands, and a rich diversity of reptiles, mammals, and birds. At least 214 bird species have been reported, and the National Audubon Society has designated the park as an Important Bird Area of Global Significance. In 2016 the state of South Carolina made the privately-owned facility a wildlife sanctuary.
